***Excerpt from March 27, 2020 e-mail to Ms. Elizabeth May, Member of Parliament.***

*Ms May,*

*I am writing this note to you as a concerned Canadian. This is not something I do on a regular basis, however we do not live in normal times.*

*I don't know what to make of your recent comments regarding [your lack of] support for Canada's oil and natural gas industry! And while I understand you have a deep dislike, distrust and general disregard for this industry I am confused by your comments.*

*I am the CEO of a large public company and over the years I have been forced to lay off over 1,500 of our employees (Canadians by the way) as you and many others implemented so many initiatives and roadblocks to stifle the industry from reaching world markets. Congrats, you did a fantastic job! Now I won't bother you with facts because I am sure you know that the US is the only export market for Canada's oil and natural gas, which is not an enviable position to be in at the best of times. And yes you know that even if Canada does not supply the world with crude oil and/or natural gas other nations simply fill the demand, nations of great environmental stewardship, human rights and other values you place in such high regard here in Canada. Today I am overseeing the suspension of service and closing of business to an industry that has meant so much to our Country and to Canadians. Your response is basically "provide no help", using your standard line of clean renewables will solve everything. Do you really believe this is viable in the short term?*

*Have you ever been in the position where you have had to let long term people know they are no longer employed? Have you ever had the calls from their family members crying, sometimes mad, but really, really scared? This is what we are dealing with today and you say “provide no help!” And you know as well as anyone that the Government cannot provide the help that Canadians will require in the long term UNLESS and without a strong viable economy. You will run out of ammo shortly under the best case scenario.*

*I won't change your mind about the industry and that's fair. But have some empathy for the hard-working families that helped build Canada's oil and natural gas industry. [And] if you really want to know what they are going through “give up your pension”, start over from scratch, get a job at an Amazon warehouse because these are the jobs we are creating today in this great Country.*

*My last point is this. Canada was once a great country. Even in the early days we could fend for ourselves as hunters, gathers and builders. Today we have no industry left that can meet Canada's needs. We are a Service Based Economy. Well you are about to find out what this type of economy is like when the needs must be imported and may not be readily available at the push of a button. The facts are that we are not self-sustainable any longer. Forget our frigging wants, I am speaking about NEEDS – you know those basics like food (most of which is imported), how about pharmaceuticals (we have less than 15 days inventory as I write this message and if the US hits peak need in the weeks to come what are the chances they will SHARE their needs with Canadians?) and yes energy. You know we once bartered, some will say negotiated our sovereignty away to our energy independence with the signing of the original NAFTA. Now we even import crude oil from Saudi Arabia and other OPEC member countries and shut down jobs for Canadians. Brilliant.*

*Canada and Canadians are very vulnerable today. Our debt levels are through the roof and even with new financial and monetary rules being invented seemingly at every downturn, and this will be the worst in our lifetime, there will be an end to this absurdity.*

*We all care about our fellow Canadians, this is not in the DNA of any single political party. But for the sake of Canada the time [for] politics is over.*
